Special meetings of the commissioners Feb. 20 1959.

Meeting called to order at the home of the the chairman
Mr. Palmerston at 8.00 P.M.

Commissioners present: Harry F. Palmerston
James T. Malone
Lloyd S. Capp

This meeting called to make a final decision on who to award the
bid for radio equipment to.

Bids of both G.E. And Motorola discussed, It was pointed out
that the Motorola bid did not specify that the equipment would
be installed for this price, so it is assumed that it would not.
and the only figure the commissioners could hold Motorola to was
for the equipment only.

Therefore on this basis the G. E. bid is lowest.

Also the General Electric equipment size and shape of units
would fit our trucks better, and Motorola units on account of shape
would require outside weatherproof cabinets at an additional
cost of \$ 30.00 per each unit five being required raising the
cost another \$ 150.00

On investigation it was found that the two antennas Motorola
would furnish cost at retail only \$ 60.00
The antenna General Electric would furnish sold at retail at
\$ 191.00 making a further difference of \$ 131.00

On the basis of the above facts resolution # 18 was passed
awarding the contract to General Electric.

This resolution # 18 becomes a part of these minutes.

Mr. Palmerston reported receiving his I. D. card to enable
the district to purchase from the Washington State surplus
warehouse in Seattle, and requested Chief Hunter to give him
a list of the tools and other things the district needs
which might be available thru this warehouse.

No further business meeting was adjourned at 9.20 P.M.
