REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS DECEMBER 2, 1971

Meeting called to order by Mr. ^{Henny} the Chairman at 7.00 P.M. at the District office in the Clinton fire station.

Minutes of the last meeting on 4 November read and approved as read.

Regular current bills in the amount of \$ 2208.50 from the firms and individuals listed on the reverse side this sheet are examined and Mr. Capp makes motion seconded by Mr. Henny, that they be allowed and vouchers approved and signed, carried.

The question of pay for the volunteer firemen for the year as reimbursement for dirty clothes, gasoline burned, and miscellaneous other related items is up and discussed. The suggestion is made to pay \$ 1.00 per meeting or drill and \$ 3.00 per alarm, and briefly discussed. This is agreed to be a fair schedule and decided to do this and is included in the above motion. Total amount is \$ 1898.00 vouchers copies for these payments are attached to these minutes.

County Treasurers report is on hand and shows \$5613.78 collected for the expense fund with \$ 290.08 in warrants outstanding as of 31 October. The G.O. bond fund shows \$ 2338.57 taxes collected during the same time for a balance of \$ 9473.75

Under new business Hunter reports the 1954 Dodge is now sold for \$400.00 after calling for bids some time back and not being successful in selling for the \$ 450.00 price advertised. This price was too high it was agreed.

The Chief now very briefly mentions the subject of the ambulance having to be called whenever the fire department receives a call for a resuscitator. Mr. Bevers has indicated that when they are called for ambulance in these cases, if the ambulance is not used they will try to collect \$ 10.00 for a service call, and if patient does not pay they will absorb the cost. The Chief says he is not in sympathy with this procedure as this at times may place a \$10.00 charge on someone who is not able or willing to pay, and he does not feel the fire department should be the one to place them in this predicament. He feels it should be looked into at a future time.

This concludes the meeting and it is adjourned at 7.20
