REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS JUNE 2, 1966

Meeting called to order by Mr. Capp the chairman at 7.00 P.M. at the office of the Whidbey Telephone Company at Bayveiw.

Commissioners present: Lloyd S. Capp  
David C. Henny  
Joseph H. Long

Minutes of the last regular meeting on May 7 read and approved as read.

Minutes of the special meeting held on May 7 read and approved with the following addition: Mr. Gay said that if the bond election fails to carry in either the September primaries, or the November regular election, there would be no charge for his services. This would leave only the election costs to be paid.

Current bills are on hand and Mr. Henny makes motion, seconded by Mr. Long that the bills be allowed, and vouchers in the amounts and to the firms and individuals listed on the reverse side this sheet be approved and signed. Carried. The total amount of vouchers approved is \$ 603.39

The bond issue is briefly discussed and Mr. Henny makes motion, seconded by Mr. Long and carried unanimously that resolution # 41 be adopted, placing a bond issue of \$ 125,000 on the September primary ballot.

The secretary suggests that it would be time to start planning on the ways and methods of reaching the public with the need for the bonds, and the importance of passing.

A letter to the Editor of the Whidbey Island Record outlining the needs and purposes, and some of the benefits. Also to write letters to the various organizations on this end of the Island asking their support of the bonds.

To answer the question from taxpayers of how much it would cost them for the bonds, the consensus of opinion was, to use a tax valuation of \$ 1000 and tell them to check on their tax statement and multiply this figure by 3 mills to get their cost per year in taxes.

The secretary also suggested that a mimeo sheet could be made up for pass out and any other method of distribution, briefly outlining the needs and the benefits. This method to be used at time just previous to the election.

It was also suggested that the secretary call the editor after this meeting and advise her that the resolution was passed, to place the issue on the September primaries. This would be the start of the campaign.

There was no further business and motion to adjourn at 8.15
