REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS MAY 5, 1966

Meeting called to order by Mr. Capp the chairman at 7.00 P.M. at the public meeting room of the Whidbey Telephone Company at Bayveiw.

Commissioners present: Lloyd S. Capp  
David C. Henny  
Joseph H. Long

Minutes of the last meeting on April 7 read, and approved as read.

Current bills are on hand and Mr. Henny makes motion, seconded by Mr. Long that the bills to the firms and individuals listed on the reverse side this sheet, and in the amount of \$555.96 be allowed, and vouchers be signed. Carried unanimously.

The chief now reports that the siding has now been completely installed on the Freeland fire station, and that the building looks very good.

The chief also suggests that the District should buy the lot next north of the Freeland fire station for possible future expansion of the station there. He says that the way the area is growing, there could be aneed for this in the future. He also reports that the price has now gone from \$ 2500 to \$ 3000 for the lot. There is more less agreement that this should be done, if the G.O. bonds carry this fall in the election.

~~The discussion now is directed to the bond issue, in the amount to place on the ballot. After a short discussion it is unanimously agreed it should be for \$ 125,000. Asking for, and having the amount approved does not mean the entire amount will have to be sold and the money spent. The main reason for this amount is, that costs are going up, and next year this amount may be needed.~~

~~Mr. Henny makes motion seconded by Mr. Long that \$ 125,000 be the amount asked for at the election. Carried unanimously.~~

Hunter reported that he had talked to Roger hedgecock of the Langley fire department, relative to the Distict placing a truck at Langley for the town to house and the volunteers to man on outside calls in the district. Hedgecock later called Hunter and told him he had brought the matter up at thier meeting on Monday, and the department was very much in favor of the idea. and he had been instructed by the department to present a letter of reccomendation to the Langley Town council to this effect. This would be a preparatory start in case the District approaches the town regarding it. \*

Mr. Henny suggests that the fire Commissioners should pursue this matter with the Langley Town Council.

The Chief reports that on May 2 there was an fire alarm at Sunlight beach, and no one reported in from Maxwellton station to answer the alarm. He said he called John Patton, and John had not heard the siren even though he was home at the time. Patton now did report to the scene of the alarm. Hunter says this points up the need for alerting receivers in firemens homes.

The secretary had, earlier in the meeting read a letter from Mr. James Gay an attorney from Seattle, saying he would like to meet with the fire Commissioners on Saturday May 7 at 10.30 A.M. to discuss the resolution,

and other legal aspects of the issuance of bonds etc.

The commissioners agreed that they would meet at this time with Mr. Gay.

There was no further business, and meeting was adjourned at 7.45.
