

Brief resume of trip to Cornelius Oregon by Mr. Capp, Mr. Henny, and Chief Hunter with Mr. Alden.

Trip was scheduled for Aug. 9 but due to Mr. Henny not being able to go this day the trip was made on Thursday Aug. 10.

The three above named met Mr. Alden at Mukilteo at 7.00 AM and had a most agreeable trip to the factory at Cornelius, arriving there at 12.08.

Following up on Mr. Hall's ~~have~~ invitation, he invited us to have lunch with him

- 1 - 4, 6 volt batteries instead of two 6 volt and one 12 volt at \$ 75.00 additional
- 2 - Two inch discharge line to rear of truck in addition to the 1 1/2 preconnects in the compartments at \$ 25.00 additional.
- 3 - 1 extra roof spotlight, \$ 16.20 additional.
- 4 - Electric water tank gauge on pump panel \$ 7.50 additional.
- 5 - 1 ten foot aluminum attic ladder \$ 47.00 additional.

There is a deletion of \$ 22.00 from the bid price for the district furnishing the canvas for the horse bed cover, agreed on.

Total of the additional items added was \$ 170.70 plus tax and less canvas of \$ 22.00 making a net additional cost of \$ 148.70 to bid price.

There was on hand a truck just finished, almost identical to what we have ordered. Mr. Hall's Son Ernie took Mr. Alden and Mr. Capp for a trial run in this truck which was loaded with 1000 gallons of water. He then took Mr. Henny and Hunter for the same run namely to Hillsboro. The truck performed very fine, seeming to have plenty of power, steering and handling fine with plenty of brakes to stop.

All were impressed with the performance of the truck.

After thanking Mr. Hall for his ~~courtesy~~ ~~courtesy~~ and kindness to us we left at about 3.30 to return home.

We stopped by Andy Johnson's home near Tacoma for a brief time and arrived back at Mukilteo at 10.30.

After thanking Mr. Alden for the fine time we were back on the ferry at 11.05

Consensus of opinion is that the workmanship and materials used in the trucks is of the best, and no mistake has been made in selection of their truck, for the district.
