Joint Fire Training Academy Strengthens Island Fire Services

South Whidbey Fire/EMS (SWFE) joins with Oak Harbor Fire Department in a Fire Training Academy from now through early May. This year's collaborative effort is training eight new career firefighters here on Whidbey, five from Oak Harbor Fire Department and three from SWFE. Locations at both Oak Harbor and South Whidbey allow recruits to train on fire engines and support equipment they will be using, as well as get to know who they will work with once they join their respective fire departments.

By training recruits locally rather than at the state academy in North Bend, both agencies make more efficient use of personnel and resources as they deliver high-quality, hands-on instruction tailored to both Oak Harbor and South Whidbey.

The shared academy not only saves money, it strengthens operational consistency and teamwork between both departments for whenever sizeable emergencies bring them together.

SWFE Lieutenant Leah Kalahiki serves as SWFE officer for our recruits, Nikki Hagen, Drew Harvey, and Jacob Lykken.

The joint academy reflects commitments of both fire departments to smart collaboration, fiscal responsibility, and best possible training for firefighters you depend on whenever you need them.
