Serving Beyond Our Borders: SWFE's Role in State Mobilizations

Since 2025, South Whidbey Fire/EMS has taken a significant step forward in supporting our neighbors across Washington.

Last year marked the beginning of our formal participation in the Washington State Patrol's wildland fire mobilization program—a collaborative effort that allows local fire districts to deploy resources to large-scale emergencies that exceed a single jurisdiction's capacity.

In our inaugural year, SWFE successfully deployed personnel to assist with two major wildland fires and provided critical aid during the Skagit County floods. These deployments offer our members invaluable, high-intensity experience that directly benefits our district's readiness.

The State of Washington reimburses SWFE for the use of our fire engines, the wages of the deployed staff, and the cost of "backfilling" personnel to ensure our local stations remain fully staffed and ready to respond to calls right here at home.

As we look toward the summer of 2026, forecasts indicate a potentially busy fire season across the Pacific Northwest. While our teams are ready to deploy where needed, our primary focus remains the safety of our own community.

The South Whidbey School District is making strong progress on its \$79.8 million bond project, approved by voters in November 2023. The investment results in modernizing aging infrastructure and creating updated learning environments for students in grades ITK-12. We are entering into the second year of a three and half year project.

Work completed:

Elementary new inclusive playground, detention pond improvements, and removal of unusable portable classrooms.

Current construction: Elementary bathroom renovations and a new pick-up/drop-off loop expanding into the lawn at the right of the entrance. Middle/High School campus roof replacement, exterior renovations (new masonry, windows, and metal siding), and interior updates to locker rooms, the main office, and classrooms.



Upcoming construction: Summer 2026 will bring the project's most significant phase, including athletic field and track replacement. The track will be closed from June 2026 to Spring of 2027. Along with mechanical system upgrades at both campuses, and elementary office and entryway improvements.

Construction Continued...

A key achievement has been keeping disruption minimal. No student days or district events have been lost during the 2025-2026 school year, thanks to careful scheduling, temporary relocations, and close coordination between school staff and construction teams.

The district is committed to finishing on budget while honoring the community's trust and delivering facilities that will serve South Whidbey students for generations.

Staying Safe at Home

Great Summer days can come with a high fire risk. Let's keep Summer fun by preventing devastating wildfires.

Fire prevention starts on your property. As the weather warms and fuels dry out, we ask all residents to remain vigilant. Please:

• **Maintain defensible space** by clearing dry brush and debris from around your home. Creating a buffer zone around your structure is the first line of defense against fast-moving summer wildfires.

• **Monitor burn bans.** Summer conditions often necessitate restrictions on outdoor burning to prevent accidental ignitions.

• **Follow all local ordinances.** Fire officials warn that 2026 could rival the most extreme record for heat and dryness.
