Regular meeting of the Commissioners August 4 th 1960.

Meeting called to order at 8.00 P.M. at the home of the chairman Mr. Palmerston.

The county assessors preliminary report of the districts assessed valuation for the year 1961 was examined and it shows that the districts valuation is \$ 3,308,740.00. This figure is only tentative and is subject to a slight revision up or down, but is given ~~to~~ in order for the commissioners to have figures on which to base their budget for the ensuing year.

Mr. Malone reports that he had a talk with Jack Daniels and Jack told him he would donate a lot to the district, on his place facing on the new highway when it was known where highway would go. Jack also said he had talked to Mrs. Martin of the Whiteacres rest home, and explained the situation to her and that she seemed agreeable to waiting until this could be accomplished.

Chief Hunter told of the water situation at Maxwellton in regard to filling the truck there. He reports that the creek at Ran Ericksons is out as far as a water supply is concerned to fill the Maxwellton truck. He states that Bud Waterman has a 675 gallon tank which he will sell to the district for \$ 50.00 including enough timbers to build a tower on which to place the tank. Hunter proposes to place the tank beside the Maxwellton station, with a slow running automatic float valve to keep it full from John Pattons water supply. *(never carried thru)*

Mr. Capp made a motion which was seconded by Mr Malone to give Hunter permission to purchase the tank from Waterman.

Hunter also reported that Spokomish County Fire District number one has a hose coupler which they will sell for about \$ 65.00. Hunter reports that he has had trouble with the hose on the Maxwellton pulling couplings (truck)

and asks to buy the coupler from Spokomish Co. Fire Dist. No 1 and pay for it next year.

A motion was made by Mr Palmerston and seconded that Hunter be given permission to purchase the coupler.

Hunter also reported that he has a meeting scheduled for Sunday the 7 th of August at 11.00 A.M. with home owners at Mutiny Bay Shores near Admiralty resort, to talk over their plans for them to establish some form of first aid fire protection with for themselves until the fire department could get there in case of a fire along their dead end street.

There being no further business, meeting was adjourned at 9.20 P.M.
