County Treasureres report on hand and shows a balance of \$ 9,168.85 with warrants in the amount of \$ 541.90 outstanding as of August 31. Taxes collected for the month were \$ 148.74 expense fund. The G.O. bond fund shows a balance of \$ 1344.95 with taxes collected in the amount of # 151.89

Hunter, under new business says that Marvin Berkelund one of the Clinton department members would be interested he belatives, in a part time job with the District as he is now working parttime for the Clinton Water District as service man and meter reader.
